1. Travelling to Reutlingen

Reutlingen can be easily reached by air, train or car. The closest international airport is Stuttgart. There is a bus connection from Stuttgart airport to Reutlingen, which takes approximately 45 minutes. For further information, please refer to section “Arrival in Reutlingen” below.

Alternatively, you can hire a car at the airport and be in Reutlingen within half an hour. If you fly into Munich or Frankfurt international airports, you can take the train from the respective airport to Reutlingen train station. The train journey from Frankfurt airport can take two hours with the Intercity Express (ICE) to Reutlingen and from Munich airport it takes approximately four hours. Other airports in the region offering European flights include Karlsruhe/Baden-Baden airport and Memmingen airport. At all airports, there are rental car services available as well as public transportation. Please check the respective website for further information.

2. Formalities

Visa

If you are not an EU citizen, you might need a visa to enter Germany. Please check whether a visa is required for your country of origin. This visa can only be obtained via the German embassy or consulate in your country of residence. Please contact us if you need a “Letter of Acceptance” in order to apply for a visa. Please note that it is your own responsibility to apply for a visa in time for your travel.

Health Insurance

Please make sure that your health insurance covers your stay in Germany and transportation to your home country in case of illness. EU nationals are covered by the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Be aware that transportation to your home country in case of illness is not covered by the European Health Insurance Card.

3. Arrival in Reutlingen

Arriving from Stuttgart airport

[The Expresso bus \(X3\)](#) from Stuttgart Airport to Reutlingen runs once an hour from early in the morning to late in the evening; services on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays are also available. The bus is painted with yellow and black squares, and the bus stop is right in front of the airport exit at arrivals. The trip to Reutlingen takes about 45 minutes and costs around € 7. The ticket can be bought from the bus driver. Upon arrival in Reutlingen city (exit at the Stadtmitte bus stop), you then need to get another bus, No. 4 or No. 11 (direction Hohbuch). This will take you to the ESB campus (approx. 10 minutes). Get off at the Hochschulen bus stop.

Arriving from other airports

If you arrive at any other airport in Germany, take a train directly from the airport to Stuttgart's main train station. Frankfurt airport has a train station for ICE and IC (long-distance intercity) trains located in Terminal 1. Trains to Stuttgart usually arrive and depart on platforms 4 to 7. The train ride to Stuttgart will take about an hour-and-a-half. Stuttgart train station is a terminus station. Take the train in the direction of Tübingen, which runs at least once an hour. Get off at Reutlingen main station (Reutlingen Hauptbahnhof). Leave the train station through the main entrance, turn right and follow the Bahnhofstraße until the street bends to the left. Descend the steps in front of you to access the bus stop Unter den Linden/Hbf. Take bus number 4 going in the Hohbuch direction and get off at the Hochschulen bus stop or Pestalozzistraße. Another possibility is to go to the Liststraße/Hbf bus stop and take bus number 11(direction Hohbuch) which also stops at the bus stops Hochschulen and Pestalozzistraße.

Arriving by car

If you travel by car, follow the motorway (highway) A8 and exit Reutlingen/Tübingen. Then follow the national highway (interstate) B 27 in the direction of Tübingen and exit Reutlingen Nord. In Reutlingen, head for the city centre (Stadtmitte)and then follow the signs to the university (Hochschule).

Transportation:

Buying Tickets: One way and day saver tickets can be bought either from the bus driver, a ticket machine or via mobile phone using the new naldo app available for apple and android phones in

German, English and Arabic. An online ticket shop is also being introduced this year at www.naldo.de. Monthly and annual tickets can be bought at a ticket machine or from a sales office. An example is the DB-Service Center inside of Reutlingen Main Station. Others can be found [here](#).

5. Getting around the Campus

Internet Access

Internet access via Wi-Fi is available throughout the campus. As a guest researcher, you can connect to the university Wi-Fi via the wireless network "myCampus" using the university IT account log-in details handed to you upon arrival. With this connection you can access the internet and the school's network servers.

As a guest lecturer on campus for a short stay, you will receive a special guest account to access the internet via the WiFi network "guestCampus" with your laptop or mobile device. All you need to do is connect your device to the Wi-Fi network "guestCampus". A user name and password are not required. Open any web page in your browser and enter the access information given to you by your host upon arrival. Prior to your arrival, please let us know how many devices you would like to connect so we can provide you with the appropriate number of log-ins.

If your home institution uses eduRoam and you already have an account, then you can use your eduRoam login to get WiFi access at Reutlingen University

Copying and printing

Multi-functional devices are available on each floor for printing and copying.

Reutlingen University also offers a printing service for students, staff and lecturers for large print jobs. The original can be sent by email.

Day trips

Tübingen:

Reutlingen's neighbouring town, Tübingen, is one of Germany's oldest and loveliest university towns with over 83,000 inhabitants and 28,000 students. The town's silhouette is shaped by the castle, narrow alleys, street cafés, wine taverns, excellent restaurants, various shopping opportunities and much more. A trip on one of the punting boats along the River Neckar reveals a fascinating view of the scenic Neckar front with the Hölderlin tower. Outletcity Metzingen:

Originally founded in the 1970s in an old brick factory being home to the Hugo Boss brand and its textile centre, the outletcity Metzingen was a modest and quiet sales outlet for the employees working for the gentlemen's tailor. Nowadays, the internationally renowned shopping outlet registers over 3.5 million visitors from 185 countries per year. The outletcity Metzingen is considered one of the most successful factory outlets in Europe. It carries more than 70 top brands and prices are substantially reduced throughout the whole year.
